DFO SCHOLARSHIPS FOR INDIGENOUS PEOPLES IN CANADA

IOI-Canada is pleased to offer **three scholarships for Indigenous peoples in Canada** to participate in its two-month training programme on *Ocean Governance: Policy, Law and Management* at Dalhousie University in Halifax. Funding is provided under Fisheries and Oceans Canada's Oceans Management Contribution Program and covers travel, tuition, course materials, field trips and living expenses including accommodation in a Dalhousie residence.

COURSE OVERVIEW

- Intensive, international, interdisciplinary course running full-time from 20th May 17th July 2020.
- Held each year since 1981 with over 735 alumni from more than 100 countries.
- Global perspective on ocean and coastal governance issues with emphasis on viewing the ocean as a complex system with varied users and multiple, often competing and conflicting, uses.
- Over 220 hours of lectures, interactive discussions, field trips, simulations and exercises, individual participant presentations, plus concluding symposium and round table of ocean specialists.
- Key issues include Ocean Sciences, Law of the Sea, Integrated Coastal and Ocean Management, Climate Change, Fisheries & Aquaculture, GIS, Maritime Security, Marine Transportation, Energy, Sustainable Development.
- Up to 100 guest speakers including local and international experts and practitioners.
